

Each piece in Not Quite a Genius is different from the last, yet the whimsical, gentle honesty of the author's voice remains constant. Some pieces are flat out silly and a lot of fun, some are heartfelt confessions of a sweet boy turned sweet man/boy, and some are light versions of dark satire about living in today's society.
