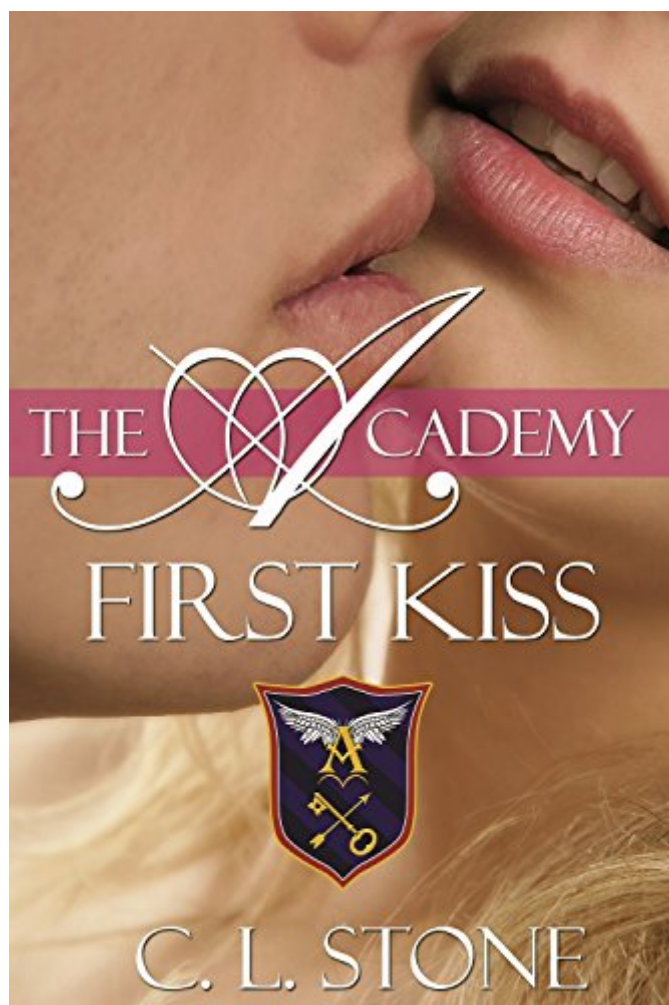


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First Kiss: The Ghost Bird Series: #10 (The Academy Ghost Bird Series)

I want to start off by saying that I love this series! Kota finally got to kiss Sang! I've read every entry in this series, as well as the Scarab Beetle Series, and I wait anxiously for each new book. I'm not exactly sure what happened with this book though, but it was terribly edited. There were wrong words, at times too many words, and a couple of times where the sentence just stopped without finishing. I found it very distracting, taking me away, albeit momentarily, from the flow of the story. As far as the story goes, it's a definite 5 stars, but the extremely poor editing job has me giving it a grudging 4 stars. That said, I still can't wait for the next one!

The whole Academy series is great! In First Kiss, Sang finally gets to kiss the first Academy boy she met, but it doesn't come without problems. They go to Academy camp, where prospective new members are tested to see if they belong in the Academy. Thru the week, Sang impresses not only other campers, but the Academy members who will decide if she deserves a chance to join them. At the end of camp, Sang's recent phobia is brought to light, and causes a fight between the boys. An urgent call puts the fight on hold, as they rush to meet the new problem facing them. This whole series has been full of adventure, and drama that seems too heavy for teenagers, but they handle it well. I can't wait for the next book to see how Sang's journey ends!

Can it even get any better than this. These books just pull you into the story. Like it embeds deep into your soul. Sang and the guys are going to camp. They didn't warn her it was The Academy's camp. Now she has to learn the hard way. But all Sang can think about is if she can stay with the guys and Kota needing to know about the plan for them all. There's so much more that happens. If you're a true fan of the series, you're loving this book as I do. If you are a beginner you need to start at the beginning. Even though we FINALLY get to see what the Academy is all about, the overall idea of the Academy just seemed very childish and not very spyish, the way I initially imagined it being. It's basically volunteer work. They're not spies or anything remotely similar! Not only that but I felt like Stone was really trying to lay a lot of political/moral views she has as far as the Lake aspect is concerned. It's okay that everyone has their own views on such matters but no one needs it shoved down their throats. In addition, I feel like we're always being introduced to characters that play a big part of some of these books then they're not brought up again, like Sang's girl friend she had at Ashley Waters, what happened to her? Now Sang met another girl (Lake) that she spent more time with than the guys, does Lake have anything to do with the bigger plot?! This series has seriously taken a nose dive and I'm not sure I like where this is going. The whole Academy plot and reverse harem aspect appealed to me at first but now the way everything is being executed just seems so underwhelming.

Major Spoiler! (Ok, maybe not major...)Kota finally gets his kiss!! I love the slow burn and I love that these books are long, but they only run around a weeks time line each. I've always wondered when a book has gaps in time what they're doing?!! And I love that there are basically no gaps. We know what they're doing, we know what they're thinking (for the most part). I do wish that we got the guys' POV, but that's ok. I would definitely put this as one of my favorite books of the series. Seriously, buy this book. For reals.
