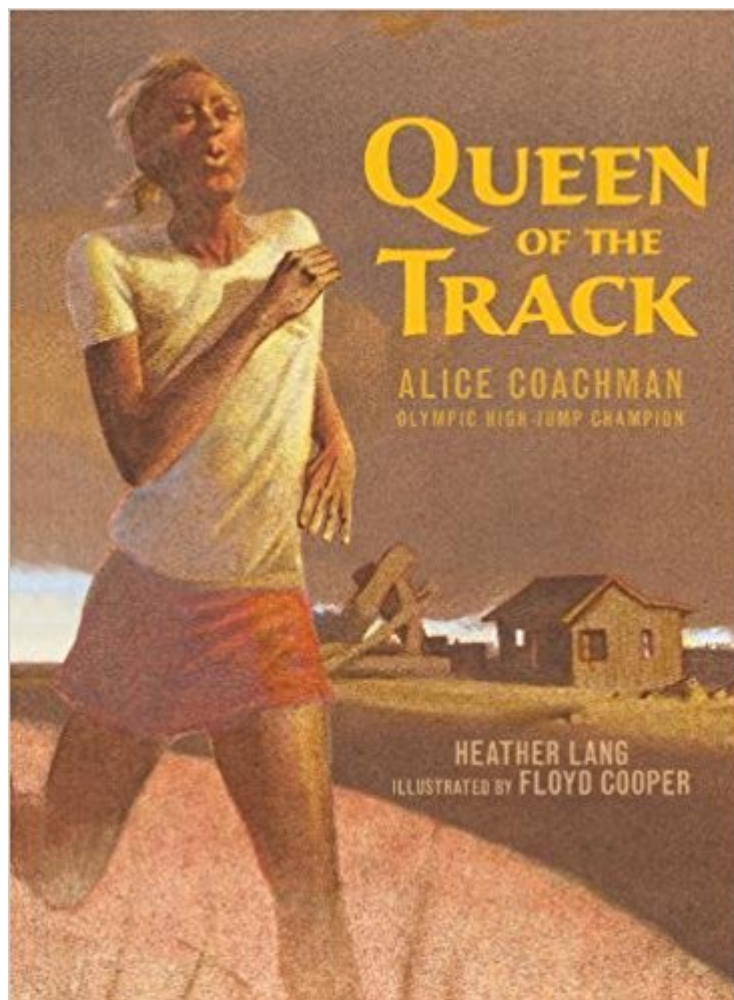




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Queen Of The Track: Alice Coachman, Olympic High-Jump Champion
