

Gary served for twenty years as professor of psychology at Trinity Evangelical Divinity School, was president of the 15,000-member American Association of Christian Counselors, and was founding editor of Christian Counseling Today magazine. He is Distinguished Professor of Leadership and Coaching at Psychological Studies Institute in Atlanta and Distinguished Professor of Psychology and Counseling at Regent University in Virginia. He writes a weekly newsletter on coaching and counseling and frequently travels overseas and within North America to speak on issues relating to Christian counseling and coaching.

I have received coach training through my state association and through independent reading and training and this book has been the most helpful in assisting me to transition from a more "informal" approach to coaching to beginning to take on "formal" coaching clients. I haven't had a paying client yet, but that's because I'm in ministry and I'm willing to "coach" many people as part of my position. I coach staff and other growing leaders within my organization. But I was stuck trying to move into more formal coaching relationships and this book helped me greatly to get over that sticking point.
