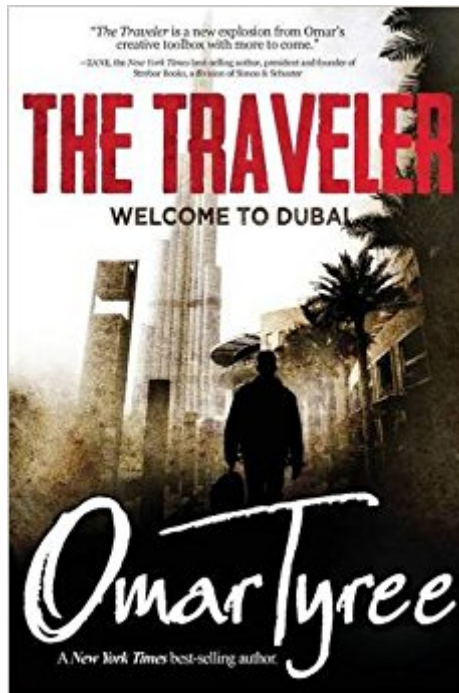

Welcome To Dubai (The Traveler)



Synopsis

When American Gary Stevens decides to explore the immaculate tourism haven of Dubai in the Middle East, he finds much more than he bargained for. Plans for a peaceful and harmless visit to the exotic land of seven-star hotels, international culture, food and shopping, quickly change when Gary attracts the attention of a beautiful, rebellious and enticing Muslim woman. Gary stumbles into a violent labor revolt triggered by the death of a poor immigrant construction worker, who falls from one of Dubai's hundreds of fast-developing buildings. BLACK BOND Nothing can be said about the book that isn't listed in the other reviews as far as quality in the words. Let it more importantly be said that an African American man bold enough to try something different is something seldom seen, and something I strive for in my own literature. We don't have a black James Bond and the Traveler gives us that. I also like that the cover isn't as dramatically hip hop as most urban lit and that the author is striving to do something greater than sex, guns, and criminal behavior.
