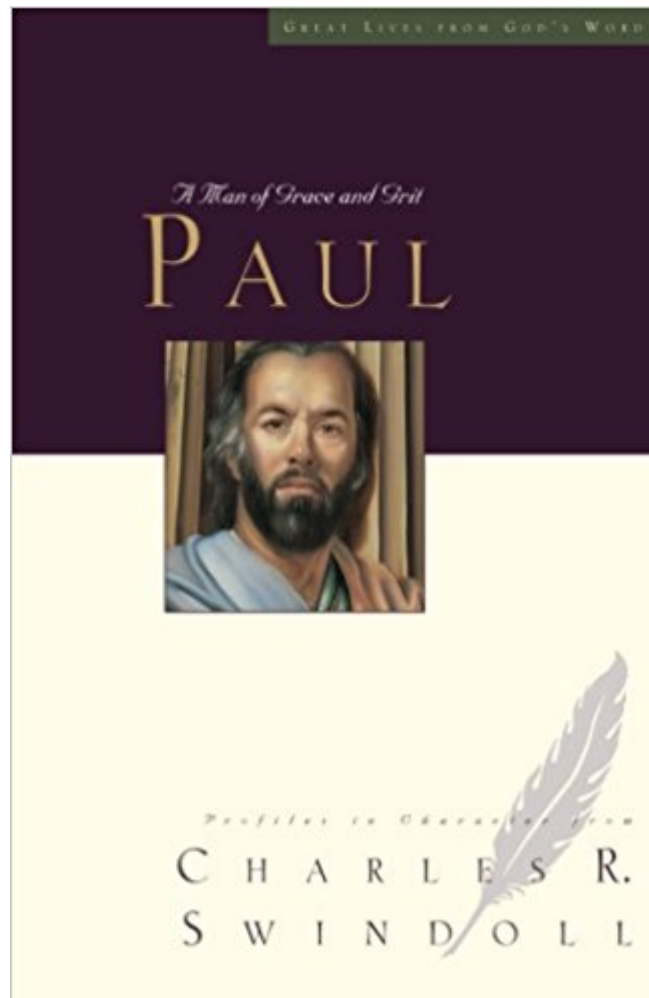


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Paul: A Man Of Grace And Grit (Great Lives Series)

Charles R. Swindoll has devoted his life to the clear, practical teaching and application of God's Word. He currently pastors Stonebriar Community Church in Frisco, Texas, and serves as the chancellor of Dallas Theological Seminary. His renowned Insight for Living radio program airs around the world. Chuck and Cynthia, his partner in life and ministry, have four grown children and ten grandchildren.

Author Charles Swindoll analyzes the Apostle Paul's character, providing ancient and current illustrations that listeners can use to examine their own lives. In a seamless delivery, narrator Raymond Todd portrays Paul's journey to Damascus, as described by Swindoll, during which he is blinded and then experiences the restoration of his eyesight by God. Then, as an example of solitude, Swindoll recounts the story of the movie CAST AWAY, about a FedEx employee who is stranded on a deserted island for four years. With light enunciation, Todd describes how, like Paul, the executive comes to surrender his pride and desire for prestige when he realizes that being on top will result in a loneliness and isolation similar to what he is experiencing as a castaway. This is not your typical biography. If you are looking for a straight forward recounting of Paul's life, read The Apostle by John Pollock, which is quoted several times in this book. This book not only follows Paul's life, it also provides application from his life. The author uses Paul's life as shown through Scripture to provide timeless truths for our lives. Paul was formerly Saul, a man who was persecuting early Christians when he himself became a follower of Jesus. At that time his name was changed to Paul. "A Man of Grace and Grit" gives more explanation of the suffering Paul endured after becoming a Christian as recorded in the Bible. It is very challenging and encouraging.

This book is amazing. It is based on scripture throughout but goes into many explanations to help clarify the times historically. Charles Swindoll is a wonderful writer and his sense of humor and realistic comments make the book come alive. It is very relevant to Christians living in today's world trying to live the life God wants from us.
