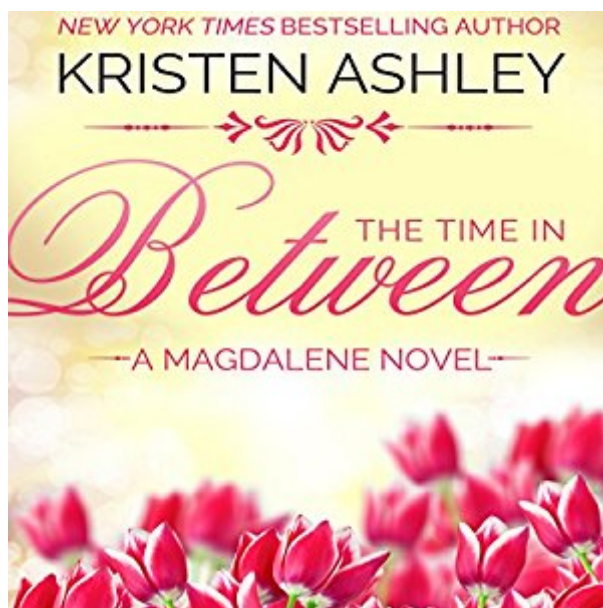


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The Time In Between: The Magdalene Series, Book 3

She didn't pick the best friends, and her family seemed to kind of detest her, but she was always loyal to them (even if they didn't deserve it). I think that it speaks volumes for someone to keep this love alive, even after those receiving her love have broken all ties. Unfortunately, there comes a point where I hoped she would grow more of a backbone, but it just seemed as though she kept allowing people to walk all over her. That was something that truly bothered me. Heroines I've loved to read about are independent, sassy, and clever. I just felt that Cady was missing a little bit of this backbone. The story itself was interesting. The huge gap in time that passed is something I always love to read about. People making mistakes, having to deal with the consequences of those mistakes, and then life bringing them back together. But in this story, I felt like something was lacking a little with this concept. Along with that, the action of this story seemed to be wrapped up rather easily. It's like all the pieces just fall into place without much of a fight. This book was quite lengthy, as well. KA is always the queen of epilogues, but a lot of the length didn't seem quite filling. Don't get me wrong, I was totally moved by so many of the characters in this story, but a lot of the time it felt like I just kept reading and reading when it wasn't necessary. This was the end to a series, so I understand the need to wrap up multiple events, but My final analysis would be that this was a decent story, but definitely not one of my tops from this author. On the whole, I love the town of Magdalene, love the characters-even the extended characters, and the feel I get every time I enter the city limits.

I mean really? For the price, look at the length of KA's books and the substance and don't you just jump up and down when they download and say "Finally, my new Kristen Ashley book has arrived!" Every single series she writes is not only worth re-reading but the characters are so well written you can't help but remember them and their stories and it's no different with Cady and Coert (even

Ok to preface this review let me say I have read almost everything Kristen Ashley has written, including the first two books in this series...and I am a huge fan. I have read and enjoyed the others in this series so I knew a little of what to expect in this book. A couple in their 40's and most likely a second chance type scenario. In the other books the love story of the H & h was not necessarily the main focus with a few other sub-plots going on. And for me that's where this one didn't quite measure up. A lot of day to day type activities but nothing to really sink my teeth into. The "bad guy" that has been in the other books was kind of in this one but he was more discussed than actually having any interaction with him (besides one scene). Of course it was neat to "visit old friends" and those scenes were probably my favorites! Didn't love this one, and not sure I'll re-read it like I do with most of her books, but I didn't hate it.

The Time in Between has bumped into the top spots of my favorite Kristen Ashley books. I felt really connected to the characters throughout the entire book. Coert was still the hot, alpha male that KA is known to write about, but he was more sensitive than her other heroes. We also got to read more from his POV and that was enjoyable. He was in tune with what was in his head and what needed to be done to get it sorted. Cady was a woman who fully embodied a sweet, always forgiving and full of love heroine. This is a book about second chances (a sub-genre that KA excels in) and the journey to happy for Coert and Cady.
