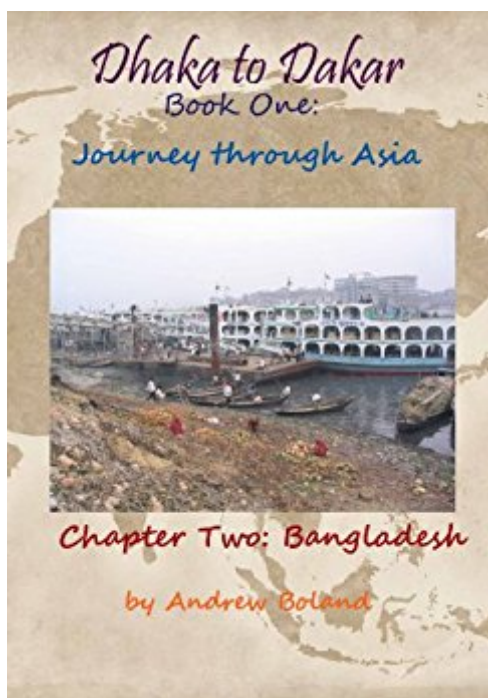


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# Dhaka To Dakar: Journey Through Asia - Chapter 2: Bangladesh
