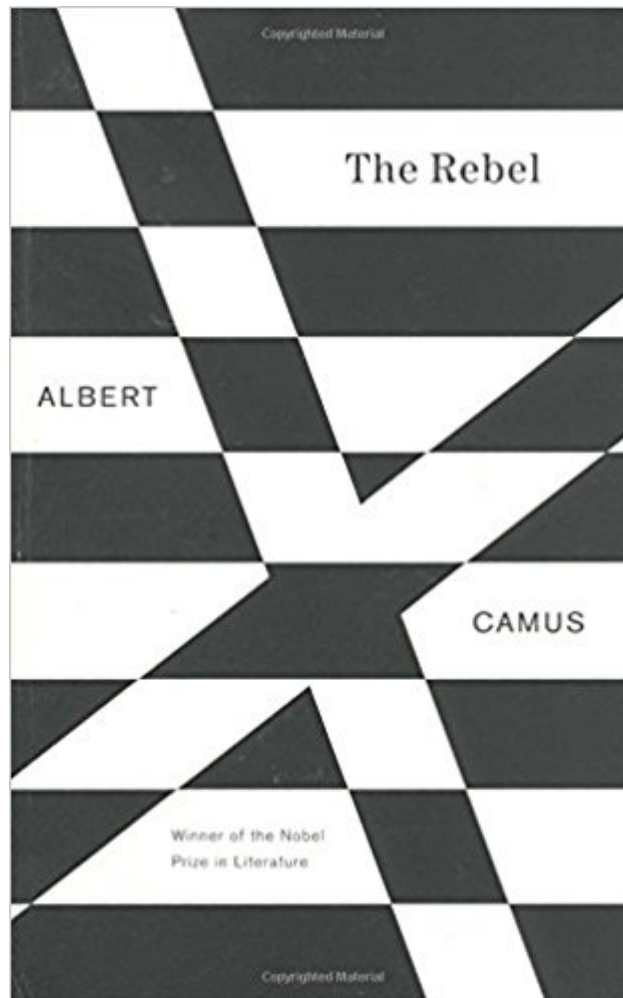




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The Rebel: An Essay On Man In Revolt

Camus' magnum opus, but with a bit of flaw at the end. Much of what he says about rebellion is true, and his description of many atheists as *"needing"* at least the idea of a god against which to rebel should be read by all open-minded Gnu Atheists. However, by winding up the book with the idea that failure of liberals to be anti-Communist is the ultimate "sin," Camus somewhat trivializes his earlier ideas. Somewhat, but not totally. Nonetheless, a more universalizing conclusion would have been better.
