

Historian and award-winning author Don Nardo has written many books for young people about modern history, including studies of the rise of Hitler and Nazism, World War II, international terrorism, and dozens of military topics. In addition, he specializes in ancient history and has published numerous volumes about the histories and cultures of the ancient Greeks, Romans,

Egyptians, and peoples of Mesopotamia. Nardo, who also composes and arranges orchestral music, lives with his wife, Christine, in Massachusetts.

Although Nardo is best known for his books about the ancient world, he is very well versed in modern history, particularly America's wars and military history. This volume, which is aimed at young readers- roughly grade 6 or 7 I'd estimate- is a fine overview of the initial battles of the Civil War. The production values of the book, by the folks at Compass Point Books, are also excellent.
