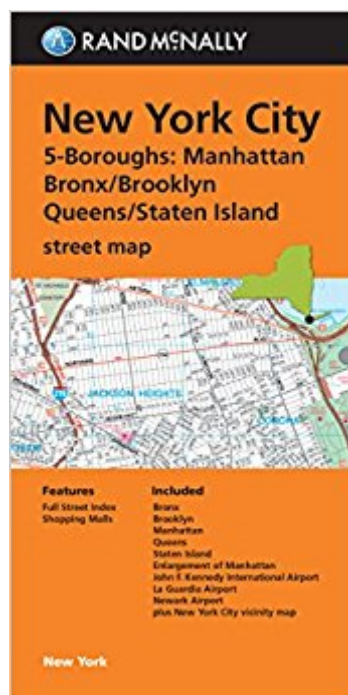

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Customer Reviews

Compared to the New Yorker's Five Borough Map (which I bought first), this is much better. Paper and print quality is excellent, and the street index is easy to read. There are even airport layouts, places of interest, hell even a Times Square Theatre index...not that crucial for anyone but a complete tourist, but still not bad and were included, I think, to make use of blank space that would be otherwise unused. As for the complaint that it folds too much....it's a folded paper map. If you hate folding and unfolding maps, you should go with a poster or some kind of mini-map. I like

comprehensive larger maps because I can plan out trips without scrolling on a computer screen. It's also nice to mark places you've been; it becomes an evolving memento. It has one more horizontal fold than the New Yorker's Five Borough map, but that allows it to be about half an inch shorter when folded. It's larger when unfolded but not excessively so. As mentioned, the paper and print quality are better, so overall I recommend it.

Includes all of the boroughs, except Staten Island is on the side opposite the rest of them. I use this map mainly to keep track of where I've been - I was inspired by my grandfather, who had a map of every street in Paris and marked down the ones he visited when he lived there. As far as navigation goes, I can't speak to it but I assume it does its job, though the text may be a little hard to read and the streets a little hard to discern if you're on the go. If you're a tourist looking for a map of New York, this isn't the one you're looking for. I would recommend one of Manhattan and maybe some parts of Brooklyn.

The map is very detailed, with parks, lakes, hospitals, cemeteries, colleges & other special places color-coded so they stand out & are easier to find. Print is a good size & easy-to-read. There is a very thorough index of street names with corresponding letter/number codes to make for quick & easy finding on the map. Major highways, streets & avenues are also shown. My only problem with it is that, with all these details, the map is super-huge when opened up & it folds many times, which makes it a bit difficult & unwieldy. The final completely folded-up version opens initially to four folds, a tad excessive, I feel, but may be necessary to keep the print a readable size.

Couldn't find a Brooklyn only map, so got this one and glad I did. It gives all the streets in Brooklyn (as well as the other boroughs) and it is helpful to have the larger overview of NYC.

After purchasing 2 other maps here...I finally located the street grid I needed for the biography I am writing! Ty
