

Rescuing Riley, Saving Myself: A Man And His Dog's Struggle To Find Salvation

Library Journal, starred review While hiking on a solo vacation in a remote, uninhabitable region of Arizona, Zachary Anderegg happened upon Riley, an emaciated puppy clinging to life at the bottom of a 350-foot canyon. In a daring act of humanity that trumped the deliberate savagery behind Riley's presence in such a place, Zak single-handedly orchestrated a delicate rescue. Zak and Riley's destinies were intertwined long before they improbably found each other. For much of Zak's childhood, he was at the bottom of a veritable canyon himself; a canyon in which imprisoning depth and darkness were created by bullies who just wouldn't quit and parents who weren't capable of love. When Zak found Riley, the puppy's condition bespoke his abusers' handiwork; three shotgun pellets embedded beneath his skin and teeth turned permanently black from malnutrition. The meeting was one of a man and a dog singularly suited to save each other. As a former US Marine sergeant, Zak was one of only a few people with the mettle and physical wherewithal to get Riley out. And in rescuing him, Zak was also attempting to save himself, conquering the currents of cruelty that swelled beneath his early life and had always threatened to drown him.

I've been following this story since Zak rescued Riley in 2010. The book is about that rescue, but it's more than that. Zak was physically and emotionally bullied through most of his childhood and into teenage years, and emotionally bullied by his parents, and Zak tells that story too. You should read this book for many reasons. If you're an animal lover, it's a no-brainer. The lengths Zak went to get this dog out of the canyon are pretty amazing. Those of us who are animal lovers understand why he did it. We know every time we do something to save just one dog, there are millions we can't help and it just seems endless. Read this book if you were a victim of bullying or know someone who is. Zak provides insight into the endless hell he endured, and he should be commended for telling such a personal story. Read this book if you want to learn something about confronting what seems like an impossible situation and solving it. Once I began reading I couldn't put it down. I can't recommend it highly enough.

"Rescuing Riley, Saving Myself" arrived yesterday and picked it up to briefly skim through it. I started reading the introduction and the credits Zachary Adneregg noted. For the longest time I felt the reasons I kept people at a distance, not readily trusting anyone, was due to the abuse and ridicule (which was from family) I received growing up, reading that made me realize I had been right. I highly recommend this book. Especially with the professional narration. I found out about Riley via Facebook and I am so happy I did. I help rescuing dogs in sever high kill shelters in Southern California. Consequently, I see a lot of dogs, and other animals, that have been abused and/or abandoned and it's so heartbreaking when they can't be saved. Those that make it out of the shelter are remarkably resilient and it's so wonderful to see how quickly they bounce back to being a happy dog. Just like Riley.

Hard to read about the abuse the author endured as a child and marveled at the man he became. His courage in rescuing Riley in the most dire of circumstances grabs your heart and won't let go. There is great depth of emotions both good and bad that defies my limited abilities to describe. Just know that bullying is a national epidemic that must be dealt with as the consequences can be lifelong and devastating. Riley and his savior were meant to be together!
