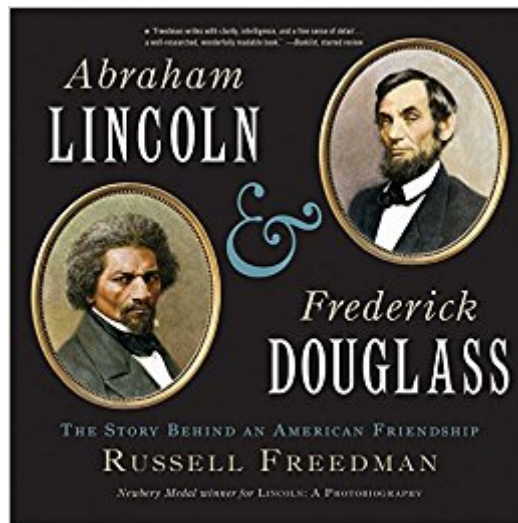

Mr. Freedman lives in New York City and travels widely to research his books.
