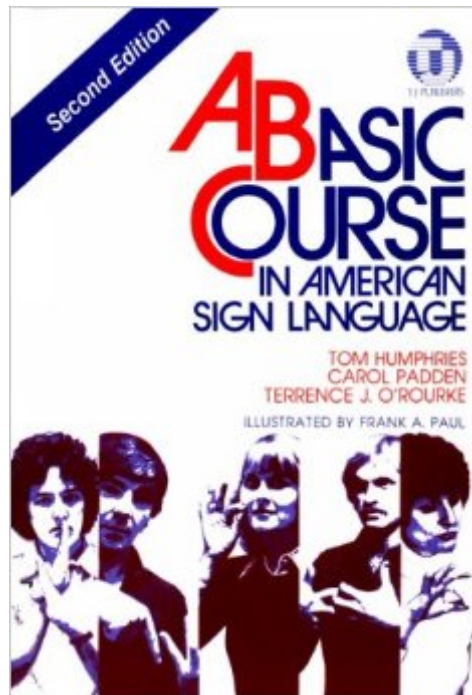




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A Basic Course In American Sign Language

One draw back is that the pictures are a little hard to interpret sometimes. As such, this is a book you would want to look up signs that you for got. And a book that you would want to have to supplement a classroom experience so that you could check to see if you have the signs correctly down.

I started taking an ASL class a year ago. I love the fact that the book is spiral bound. it lays flat while I am practicing and my daughter likes to fold it back on it's self and hold it up like a clip board when she quizzes me on vocabulary. The class I take is in the Deaf community taught by the Deaf. There are a few words they disagree with but always explain they are regional differences or old ways of saying things that some people still use so they are good to know even if you don't use them.I've been caring the book around for the past year and it has held up very well. The illustrations are clear easy to understand.

Great book for basics. A little hard to understand the signs but helpful with the internet as a guide. Recommended for a ASL introduction class so this book will be handy beyond the basics and into the intermediate classes.

This is not a great text book. It is OK as an adjunct to a class. You really can't learn sign language from a book, especially when all the diagrams are black and white sketches. ASL is by definition a language of movement. A DVD containing an illustration of the signs in video would be a

tremendous improvement, if they'd thought to include one. The book structure is also a little confusing; the examples are not terribly helpful, particularly in early chapters. Overall, it is OK, but probably overpriced.

Its old. Some of the signs are outdated. Still 95% applicable I would say.

This guide on ASL is designed as a course text book. It does a decent job of setting up opportunities to practice the signs, but it could use a little restructuring. A lot of the examples set up a sentence to sign before the vocabulary segments that define them. The definitions themselves could also be improved with a short textual description to help the more linguistic learners understand how the signs should be made. The current arrangement is designed for more visual learners than readers, which is practical given its design for course work with a live instructor. This volume does have an accompanying practice book— Student Study Guide to a Basic Course in American Sign Language. It is available as a separate purchase, which may be a trifle problematic. The two books should be paired since they reinforce the learning of the signs through the additional sign practice and the study guide is only useful with the references in the core book. I invested in this text based on some of the other reviews posted about it and recommend reading them for more experienced viewpoints. Mine come from only preliminary, cursory uses of the book, but they are my first impressions. Take them as you will.

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
